NEWS FROM ST. PETER'S SCHOOL. Welcome back to the new school year at St Peter's Catholic Primary School, where the start of term began with a whole school worship. In the Gospel Jesus explained to the Pharisees and the people that external displays of worship and obedience mean nothing if one's heart is not set on God. Mr Cunningham modelled this through two pupils; both had all the equipment and resources they needed for a successful start to the new school year, but if one pupil chose not to listen, not to work hard and not to focus on their learning, then all of their school equipment and paraphernalia was useless! In truth, the pupil who committed to their learning, progress and personal development was the one who showed the correct approach to school. So too Jesus reminded the crowds that nothing outside a person makes them good or bad, rather it is what is inside a person, what comes out of a person's heart, that either makes them good or bad. During this first weeks, RE lessons have centred on reminding the pupils of what it means to live out the school mission statement: 'To walk hand in hand with God, loving Him, loving each other and loving ourselves, doing the best with the gifts He gave us to make the world a better place'.
